

1. Adding Google Chrome Templates to Group Policy

- 1.1. Download the Google policy templates for Windows:
<https://support.google.com/chrome/a/answer/187202?hl=en>
- 1.2. Expand the policy_templates file
- 1.3. On a domain controller, locate the PolicyDefinitions folder (generally \sysvol\windows\policydefinitions)
- 1.4. Transfer the following files from policy_templates\windows\admx folder to the PolicyDefinitions folder on the Active Directory Server:
 - Chrome.admx
 - Google.admx
- 1.5. Transfer the following files from policy_templates\windows\admx\en-US folder to the PolicyDefinitions\en-US folder on the Active Directory Server:
 - Chrome.adml
 - Google.adml

2. Adding Microsoft Edge Templates to Group Policy

- 2.1. Download the Microsoft Edge policy templates for Windows (as described in Step 1 here: <https://docs.microsoft.com/en-us/deployedge/configure-microsoft-edge>)
- 2.2. Expand the policy templates file
- 2.3. On a domain controller, locate the PolicyDefinitions folder (generally \sysvol\windows\policydefinitions)
- 2.4. Transfer the following files from policy_templates\windows\admx folder to the PolicyDefinitions folder on the Active Directory Server:
- 2.5. msedge.admxTransfer the following files from policy_templates\windows\admx\en-US folder to the PolicyDefinitions\en-US folder on the Active Directory Server:
 - msedge.adml

3. Creating the Group Policy

- 3.1. On a server on the domain (or an a desktop on the domain with Group Policy Management console installed), Open Group Policy Management
- 3.2. Create and name a new policy (or add to an existing domain or user policy)
- 3.3. If this is a new policy, under Scope, add the users/domains/groups that will be affected by this policy
- 3.4. Right click and Edit the new policy

3.5. Set the Chrome Policy

3.5.1. Go to User Configuration>Policies>Administrative Templates>Google>Google Chrome>Extensions

3.5.2. On the right side, double-click "Configure the list of force-installed apps and extensions"

3.5.3. On the top left of the configuration screen, click the "Enabled" radio button

3.5.4. Under Options, click "Show"

3.5.5. In the Value box, paste in:

3.5.6. `bmpihmcncmjpdodlbbkhaoolmlmpbpc;https://clients2.google.com/service/update2/crx`

3.5.7. Click OK

3.6. Set the Edge Policy

3.6.1. Go to User Configuration>Policies>Administrative Templates>Microsoft Edge>Extensions

3.6.2. On the right side, double-click "Control which extensions are installed silently"

3.6.3. On the top left of the configuration screen, click the "Enabled" radio button

3.6.4. Under Options, click "Show"

3.6.5. In the Value box, paste in:

3.6.6. `kiihlcigeigficdmeaiknihngcljabhb;https://edge.microsoft.com/extensionwebstore/rebase/v1/crx`

3.6.7. Click OK

3.7. Close out of the editor windows, right click the policy and make sure the "Enforced" is checked.
